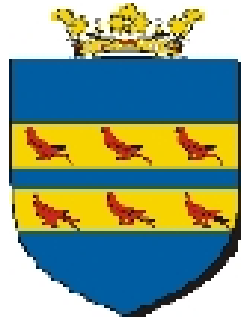

"Name is thought to have derived from: the descendant of little Borda (Little Shield): dweller near the border: dweller on a rented farm."

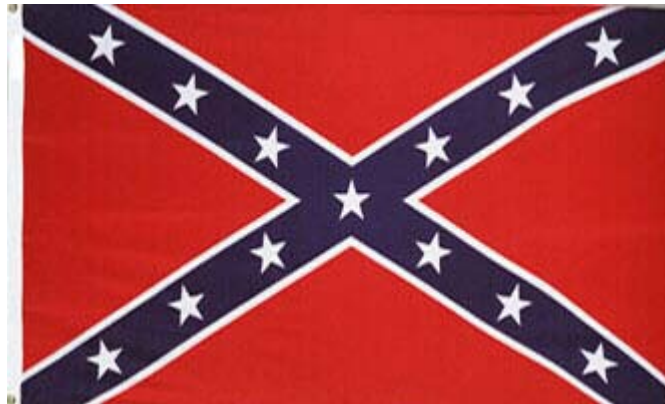

January 13, 1862 - June 30, 1863

SAMUEL GREENSBERRY BURDITT SR, was born about 1822 or 1823 in South Carolina and died June 30, 1863 in Jackson, Mississippi, son of **WILLIAM H. BURDITT** and **EVE UNKNOWN**. He married **Martha Tempy "Tempey"** born about 1822 or 1823 in South Carolina and died sometime between 1880 & 1890 in South Carolina, where abouts are unknown at this time. Parents of Martha Tempy are unknown but they were born in South Carolina, not known if Tempy "Tempey" was her maiden name. *(The Burdett families in Anderson/Abbeville Counties lived in around a community called Barnes Station on the Anderson/Abbeville County Line, Dark Corner Township, lower part of Iva, Anderson County S.C., Calhoun Falls, Abbeville County South Carolina and also Moffitsville a community just South West of Iva).*

Note:

- *(These Children Tempy T. Burdett and Georganah L. Burdett were born after S.G. Burdett's Sr. death in June 30, 1863) Thought, could she have married another Burdette?*
- Samuel and Tempy were about 17 or 18 years of age when they were married.

Census Record

- *(Some what confused about these Burditt's, "William Burditt, Elder George Burditt, S.L. Burditt, Hiram Burditt, S.G. Burditt and Younger G. Burditt" listed as living in Charleston, S.C. (I find Hiram Burditt listed on the same page, with one of my Great Great Great Grandfathers Moody Gentry and he and his family were in Anderson County, S.C. on the 1830 census and Anderson County, S.C. and on the 1850 census. There fore I believe Moody Gentry did not moved from Anderson, S.C. to Charleston S.C. and then back to Anderson, S.C.) I feel that this must be an error made by the census taker and conclude that this Burditt's were actually living in Anderson, S.C. instead of Charleston.*
- **S.G. BURDITT: MALE BETWEEN THE AGES OF 15-20; B. "BETWEEN" 1820-1825.**
- One Female: between the ages 15-20; b. "between" 1820-1825 *(I believe this to be Tempy).*

- Burdet, Tempy: Wife: Age: 50; b. abt. 1830 in South Carolina, Occupation: Keeping House; Listed as Widowed; could not read or write, Father's and Mother's birth place South Carolina. (*Tempy's age looks like 58 on the census which would be the correct*).
- Burdet, George: Son: Age: 26; b. abt. 1854 in South Carolina, Occupation: Farm Laborer.
- Burdet, Tempy T.: Daughter: Age: 15; b. abt. 1865 in South Carolina, Occupation: Farm Laborer.
- Burdet, Georgeanah: Daughter: Age: 8; b. abt. 1872 in South Carolina.
- Sarah, Francis, James, and Martha Burdet: These children I did not find as to date in the census; Samuel Burdet was listed in the Georgia Census.
- (*The surrounding households next to Maratha were the Watt Family's, Joseph Watt age 68, William Watt age 21, William Watt age 39, William M. Watt age 30, and James D. Watt age 75. My conclusion is that Martha Tempy and her 3 children were living in Moffetsville at the time of the 1880 census*).

Burditt's in the 1840 South Carolina Census

These Burditt's were listed along with S.G. Burditt; I find them no where else before, other than the 1840 census. My assumption is that the older two, G. Burditt (*believe to be George*) and Wm. Burditt could have been brothers and the others were their Children. These Burditt's, all except S. L. Burditt are listed in the 1850 census in Abbeville, South Carolina These Burditt's all lived out their lives in and around the upper state of South Carolina and Georgia. Its possible that the older two Burditt's were Children of the William Burditt who was listed in the 1790 census or Giles Burditt who had died before the 1790 census was taken, they also were thought to be brothers that came to Charleston, South Carolina from Amsterdam Holland.

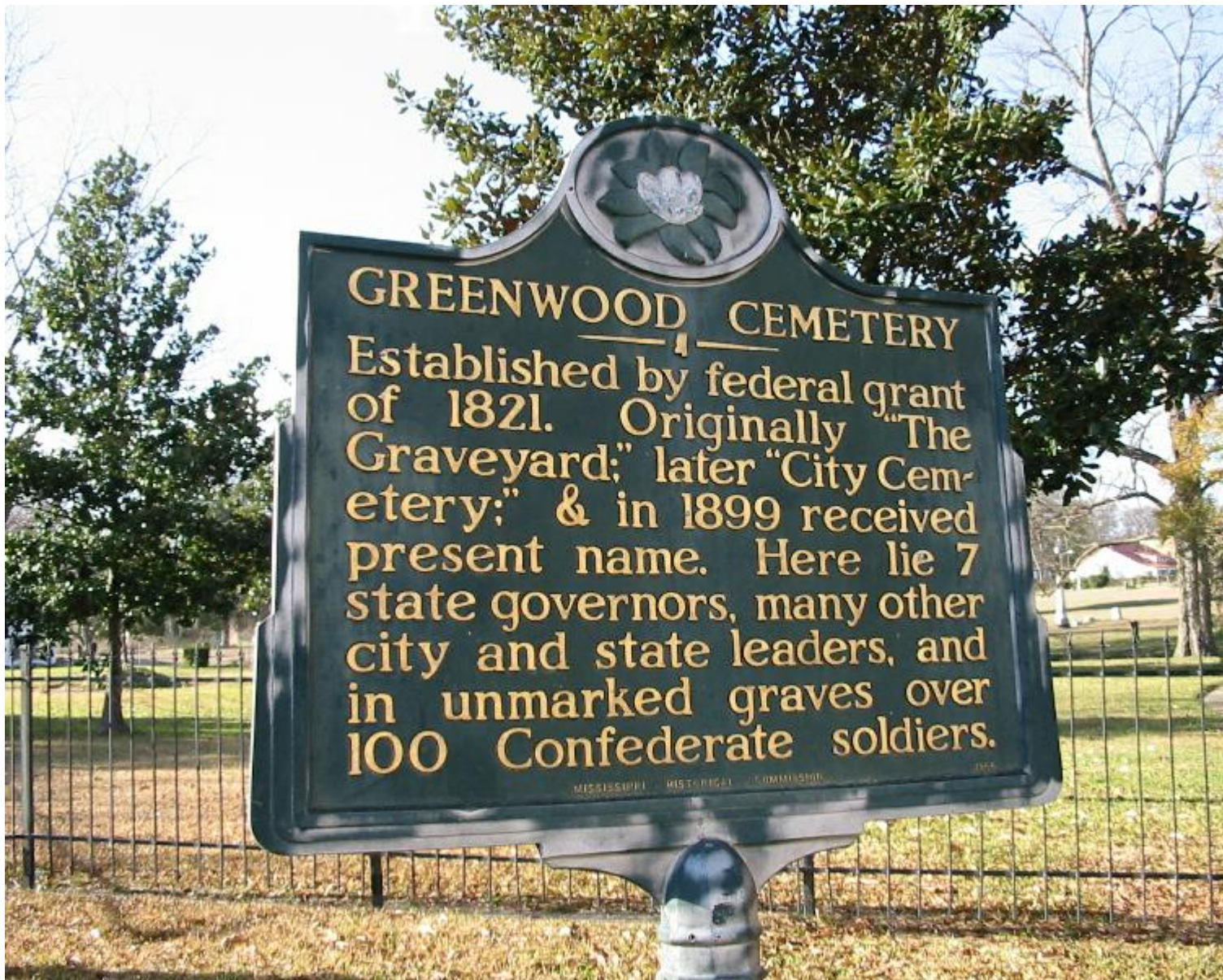
- Company F. 24th Infantry Regiment S.C. Volunteers.
- Died while in service of wounds received at Jackson, Mississippi;
- Rank: 5th Sergeant, 2nd Sergeant

Burial

- Greenwood Cemetery in Jackson, Mississippi
- Samuel Greensberry Burdett Sr. lived to be 41 years of age

Events

- *(This information came from the book of the "Struggles of The Gallant" 24th Regiment, South Carolina Volunteers, Infantry, 1861-1865 Author Eugene Jones Jr.)*
- Burdit, Samuel G. Sr. Sgt. Age 40, Company F. Enlisted at Anderson, S. C. January 13, 1862.
- Promoted to 1st Corporal on December 1, 1862.
- Promoted to 5th Sgt. on January 30, 1863.
- Absent, furlough, Mar/Apr 1863.
- Promoted to 2nd Sgt. June 1, 1863.
- Mortally wounded (*gun shot to the leg*) in Battle at Jackson, Mississippi on May 14, 1863, suffered extreme depression after learning his leg had been amputated above the knee. Captured and paroled on May 16, 1863.
- Died from wounds received in the Battle of Jackson on June 30, 1863 (*S.G. Burdit survived for 46 days after he was wounded*).
- Widow, Tempey Burdit filed claim for settlement on February 8, 1864.
- *(On page 94 "Struggles of The Gallant" it reads) "The Federals provided good care for the Confederate wounded. The next day **Captain Steinmeyer** visited the wounded and found them in a comfortable and well tended temporary Hospital. He also visited Sgt. Samuel G. Burdit Sr. Company F., whose leg the surgeons amputated just below the knee. Burdit suffered dreadfully. He became very despondent from shock and other complications and died soon after the operation.*



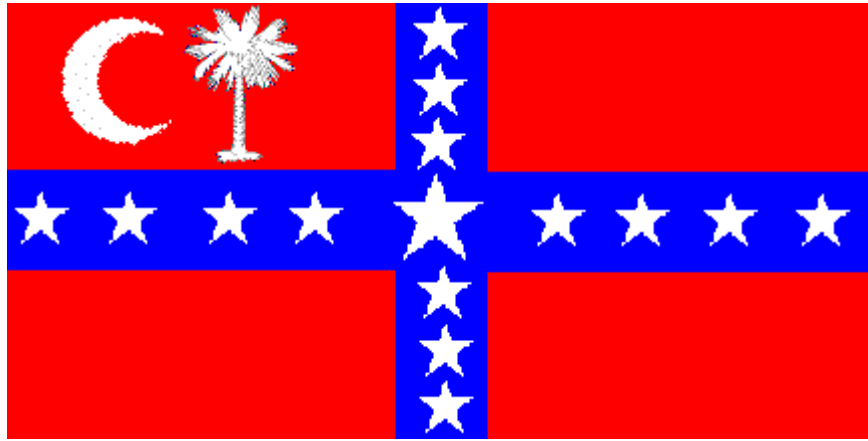

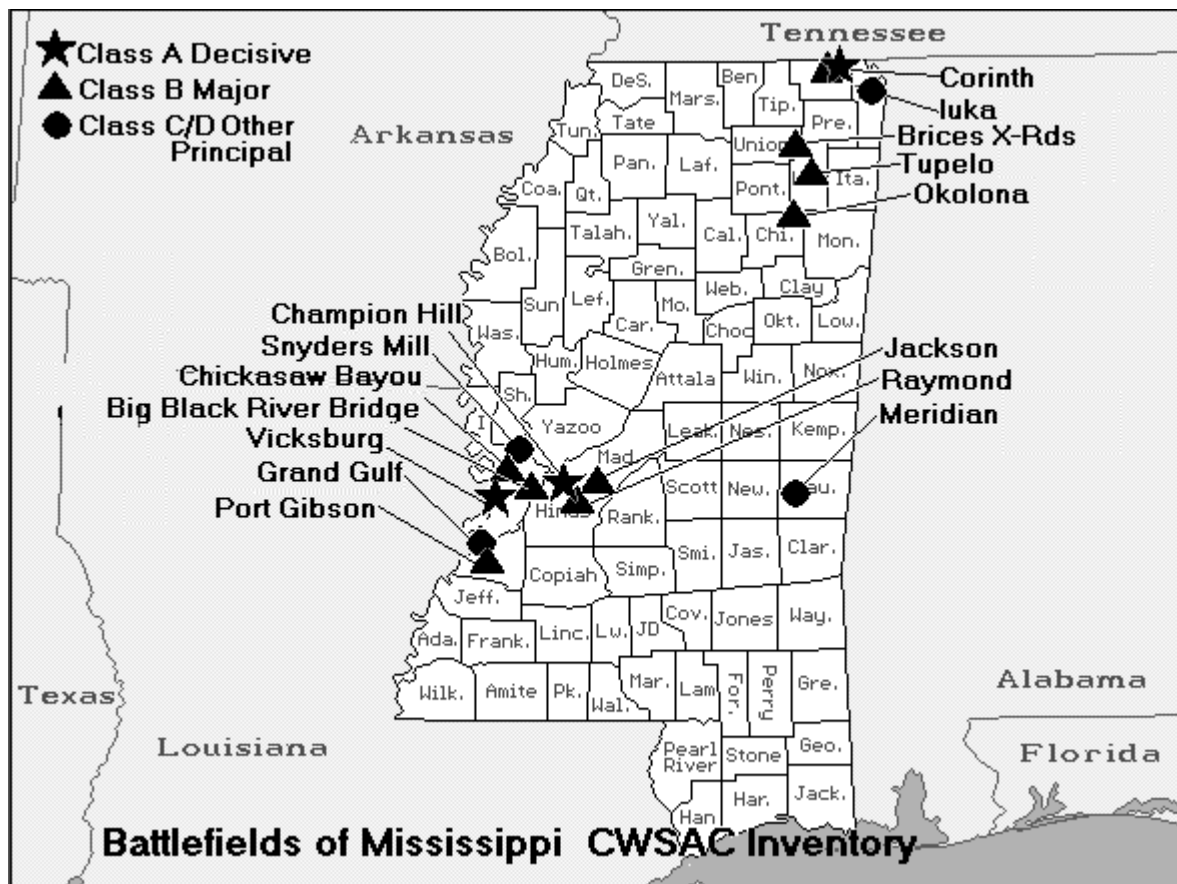
Greenwood Cemetery Civil Cemetery

Jackson Mississippi American Civil War May 14, 1863

- On May 9, 1863, General Joseph E. Johnston received a dispatch from the Confederate Secretary of War directing him to "proceed at once to Mississippi and take chief command of the forces in the field." As he arrived in Jackson on the 13th, from Middle Tennessee, he learned that two army corps from the Union Army of the

Tennessee—the XV, under Maj. General William T. Sherman, and the XVII, under Maj. General James Birdseye McPherson—were advancing on Jackson, intending to cut the city and the railroads off from Vicksburg

- Johnston consulted with the local commander, Brig. General John Gregg, and learned that only about 6,000 troops were available to defend the town. Johnston ordered the evacuation of Jackson, but Gregg was to defend Jackson until the evacuation was completed. By 10:00 am, both Union army corps was near Jackson and had engaged the enemy. Rain, Confederate resistance, and poor defenses prevented heavy fighting until around 11:00 am, when Union forces attacked in numbers and slowly but surely pushed the enemy back.
- In mid-afternoon, Johnston informed Gregg that the evacuation was complete and that he should disengage and follow. Soon after, the Yankees entered Jackson and had a celebration, hosted by Maj. General U.S. Grant who had been traveling with Sherman's corps, in the Bowman House.
- They then burned part of the town and cut the railroad connections with Vicksburg. Johnston's evacuation of Jackson was a tragedy because he could, by late on the 14th, have had 11,000 troops at his disposal and by the morning of the 15th, another 4,000. The fall of the former Mississippi state capital was a blow to Confederate morale.
